EARTH DAY IS APRIL 22 - HOW WILL YOU CELEBRATE?

April 22nd will be the 52nd anniversary of Earth Day! Have you ever wondered how the Earth Day began?

Earth Day was founded in 1970 by Senator Gaylord Nelson as a day of education about environmental issues and man's environmental impact to Earth. In cities across the U.S., more than 20 million people participated by rallying, protesting, marching, taking nature walks, coordinating community cleanups, and hosting "teach-ins" to cultivate awareness. Senator Nelson was known as an "environmental senator" but led his vision with bipartisan support focusing on encouraging youth voices.

Later that year, the Clean Air Act and Clean Water Act were adopted followed by President Richard Nixon's signed legislation that created the Environmental Protection Agency which we now know as the EPA. The general public first heard about Earth Day from a full-page ad that ran in the New York Times on Jan. 18, 1970.

Since that very first Earth Day, the awareness has grown, and Earth Day is now celebrated globally sometimes extending a full seven days - known as Earth Week - focused on green living.

The garden has been a dedicated habitat since 2008 featuring native plants which offer a healthy environment for bees, butterflies, caterpillars, and hummingbirds. Austin Community Landfill will be recognized for its certification at the 2022 Conservation Conference in Detroit this summer.

In addition, our landfill was recognized at the 2021 Annual Conference for WM of Texas and Oklahoma and honored with the

"Excellence in

Environmental Compliance" award.

In project news, we will be adding 14 new vertical wells and three new horizontal wells. We'll also be running. approximately 1600 ft. of new header



pipe. The construction will be complete in two phases with the first phase planned for completion by May.
